Liturgy of the Word - Meditation:

In the first reading Stephen sees a heavenly vision before he is thrown out of the city and stoned by the crowd. In Revelation, John reveals Jesus' testimony as the Alpha and the Omega, and His invitation to receive *the gift of life-giving water*. In the Gospel from John, Jesus prays for His disciples and those who will follow, asking His Father to perfect them in unity.

Focus: Christ calls us to unity with Him and the Father.

Jesus prays for His church to be one, to be a visible sign of Christ to the world. In His great love, Jesus invites us into His own relationship with God the Father: *I in them and you in Me*. God's powerful love enables believers to live in a unity so attractive it draws others into the love of God.

Can you not watch one hour with Me?

Friday, June 7th is first Friday. Adoration will follow the 8:30 Mass, concluding with Benediction at noon.

Jesus will bless you, your family, and the whole world for this hour of faith you spend with Him in the Blessed Sacrament.

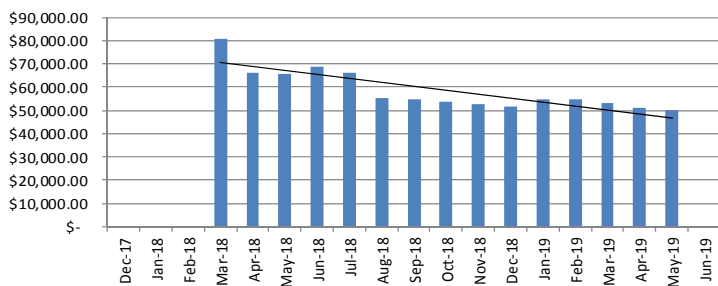
