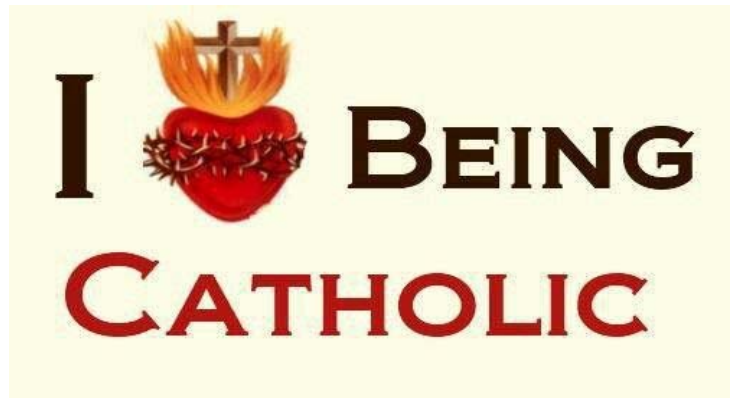

Liturgy of the Word - Meditation:

Returning from battle, Abraham meets the king of Salem who invites him to offer bread and wine to the Lord. In what is the first written account of the Last Supper, Saint Paul reminds us that he is handing on what he received regarding the true meaning of the Eucharist. Jesus welcomes the crowd and feeds them in the Gospel, instructing His disciples to do the same.

Focus: Christ fulfills in the Eucharist His promise to be with His people always.

As the source and summit of our faith, we celebrate Christ's enduring presence with us in the mystery of the Eucharist. Here we encounter His love and healing, here we are strengthened and nourished to live the Gospel and to hope for a share in His eternal life.
